Newspapers for KS5 to the BFI in London for Media Studies A-level


This term, to support the examination focus for the Media Studies A Level, I am arranging a trip to help students gain a deeper understanding of the media theory and the newspaper industry. The study session is run by the exam board in collaboration with the British Film Institute and gives students a chance to, not only expand their curriculum understanding, but to also encounter industry experts and have a chance to take part in question and answer sessions with them.

The trip will take place on Thursday 11 November. Students will make their own way to the venue and meet Mr Finn and members of staff there. They will be given a school mobile phone number to call if they face travel delays, and a member of staff will remain in the BFI foyer until all students have arrived. They will need to be at the BFI on the South Bank in London by 10.15am and the session will end at 3pm, when students should make their way home.

The cost for the trip is £16. Payment should be made electronically by Monday 11 October via www.parentpay.com. Please be advised that students will need to purchase their own train ticket in advance of the trip. Students should take a packed lunch or money for food.
