Please bring your summaries along to the first Economics lesson in September. Guidelines for the summaries:

- Approximately half a page each (typed or hand written but do make sure that it is legible)
- Use your own words. You are welcome to quote the economist or other sources but you must state that you are doing this and use quotation marks.
- Avoid terminology and explanations that you do not understand. The summaries do not need to be complex, just make sure that they give an overview of the arguments of the economists you have chosen. You may include a little about their life but the focus should be their economic perspective. Think about questions such as:
 - When was the economist writing? Was anything of note happening at the time which may influence their work?
 - Which countries have they lived and worked in? Does this influence their work?
 - What are they most famous for? There may be a particular book or argument for which they are most well-known.
 - Do they support governments intervening/getting involved in economies or would they rather let private companies operate as freely as possible?
