Drawing is one of the most important elements when studying Art. It should always be the starting point for any project, regardless of the materials or direction of your project. Drawing can take many different forms, using not just pencil, eg. photography (light), wire, clay, charcoal, paint, thread etc.

Task: Looking Closer

Using the natural world as your starting point, produce one <u>extreme close up</u> drawing of a natural object. See the examples below for close-up ideas. The object needs to fill the whole page and be representative of your ability.

In this task, I am not just assessing your technical ability, but also your **commitment and effort** in the subject.

I am also looking at your ability to follow instructions. Make sure you have read the task carefully.

Scale: 42cm x 42cm

Media: It can be a medium of your choice. It can be black and white, or colour. Your surface can be whatever is appropriate for your chosen medium. Please make sure you keep the **correct scale**, as I want to display them together in September.
